Cast Bronze

ISAAC WITKIN

May 10, 1936 – April 23, 2006

The late Isaac Witkin, an internationally renowned modern sculptor, became nearly an instant success after completing studies at London's St. Martin School of Art in the early '60s. His work was first described as having a Pop Art-like look, becoming a style of modern sculpture that revitalized the art world during the latter part of the 20th century. Often called an innovator in abstract metal sculpture, Mr. Witkin's work can be found in famous collections in the United States and throughout the world. The Bathers, fashioned in cast bronze, was commissioned by Owensboro Medical Health System shortly before Mr. Witkin's sudden death on April 23, 2006. His daughter, Nadine Witkin, will be present for the unveiling of his last commissioned piece.
